Points of Interest

Greene County - Lewis A. Jackson Regional Airport
 In Beaver Creek Township at 140 N. Valley Rd. 937-376-8107
 The Greene County Lewis A. Jackson Regional Airport has numerous facilities available for use by tenants of the airport and transient users. Creekside Trail
 The Creekside Trail is made up of 4.9 Miles of paved trail. This linear park stretches from Montgomery County to downtown Xenia. It is designed for bikers, walkers, joggers, and skaters. It is a 12-foot wide, paved trail with access at many points. In Greene County, the Creekside Trail passes by two wetland areas, providing an extraordinary view of rare plants and animals.

Welcome to Beavercreek Township

Beavercreek Township is one of the original four townships in this section of the state of Ohio. It originally extended as far north as Lake Erie. It is a beautiful valley, fertile, well timbered, rolling and picturesque.

Now Beavercreek Township is one of the premier residential communities in Greene County. It offers excellent schools, a beautiful park system, outstanding law enforcement and fire services. Beavercreek Township is situated in western Greene County. Conveniently located near the interchange of U.S. Route 35 and Interstate 675 providing access to I-75 and I-70. The Township is bordered by Sugarcreek Township, Xenia Township, and the municipalities of Beavercreek, Fairborn, Xenia and Kettering.

Beavercreek Township is governed by three board of Trustees who are elected every four years in November. Two board members are elected the year after a presidential election. The third trustee and fiscal officer are elected the year before it. As the governing body of the Township, the Board is responsible for developing policy and overseeing the Township administration. They are supported by administrative staff members, led by the Township Administrator. The Beavercreek Township Fiscal Officer and staff work to maintain the daily operations of the Township, including accounting and payroll.

Board of Trustees Meetings are held at 5 p.m. the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month in the Beavercreek Township's Community Room 2195 Dayton Xenia Road (in the lower level of Fire Station 61) Please note, public hearings are considered Special Meetings and will be held in the evening and noticed accordingly as they are scheduled.

Zoning Commission Meetings are held at 7:30 p.m. the 1st Thursday of every month in the Beavercreek Township's Community Room 2195 Dayton Xenia Road (lower level of Fire Station 61). Meetings are open to the general public.

Board of Zoning Appeals Meetings are held at 7:30 p.m. the 3rd Wednesday of every month in the Beavercreek Township's Community Room 2195 Dayton Xenia Road (lower level of Fire Station 61). Meetings are open to the general public.

Elected Trustees and the Fiscal Officer are also neighbors and are eager to discuss resident and business issues, listen to ideas and welcome interest from their fellow citizens. Fire Stations

Four fully staffed Fire Stations provide emergency medical and fire services within Beavercreek 24 hours a day. They provide fire suppression, emergency medical services (EMS), and fire prevention services to the residents of Beavercreek Township, including the City of Beavercreek, and parts of Bath Township. Each fire station has a fire engine and a medical unit available to respond to emergencies. Beavercreek Township has plans to build two additional fire stations to service growth in the community.

Growth

Established in 1946, the fire department has grown from four volunteer fire companies into a modern, suburban fire department staffed by 80+ dedicated full-time firefighters. Every day, a staff of up to 24 firefighters and paramedics located at the four fire stations provide 24-hour emergency response to any call for help.

Equipment & Personnel.

The department also has a shift commander, a ladder truck, a water tanker, a heavy rescue, a communications unit, and reserve engines and medics. These apparatuses can be staffed in a variety of ways to meet the emergency needs of Beavercreek. The Fire Department protects a greater than 50 square mile area within Greene County.

Beavercreek Township is under contract with the Greene County Sheriff's Office. The Township owns a fleet of police cruisers manned by the Sheriff's Office who patrol the Township 24 hours a day on two overlapping shifts.

The Sheriff's Office Sub Station is in the Beavercreek Township Fire Department Station 61 at 2195 Dayton-Xenia Road, lower level. The Sheriff's Office Patrol provides sophisticated specialized services to the Township.

Road Department

Beavercreek Township's Road Department responsibilities include performing maintenance, repair and improvements for approximately 44 miles of township roads and road right-of-ways, maintenance of 72 township vehicles including both fire and road vehicles along with various pieces of small equipment, all township owned buildings including 4 fire stations, fire administration, the township offices, the Beavercreek Library, and Beaver Cemetery.

The Township Road Department also performs curb and catch basin repairs, ditch drainage, funeral and burial services, the pavement resurfacing program, pot-hole repair, road mowing in right-of-ways, and snow and ice control.

They are responsible for right-of-way permits, street signs, and tree trimming in right-of-ways. They perform grounds maintenance of Leist Park which includes mowing, trimming, landscaping and shelter maintenance.
