Welcome to our community. The Fire Department is always available to meet your needs in fire or medical emergencies.

The Fire Insurance Rating for Beavercreek is as follows:

- Class 9 – Where there is no public water system.
- Class 6 – Where a public water system is available and fire hydrants are installed.

There are four (4) fire stations located:

- Station #1 – 2498 Dayton-Xenia Road
- Station #2 – 3777 Dayton-Xenia Road
- Station #3 – 3100 Kemp Road
- Station #4 – 3633 Indian Ripple Road

Land purchased for future Fire Station #5 is located at the intersection of New Germany Trebein Road and Fairground Road.

The personnel staff consists of the following:

- 1 – Chief
- 1 – Assistant Chief
- 77 – Volunteer Firefighters
- 9 – Paid Full-Time Firefighters
- 12 – Part-Time Firefighters

All firefighters are Ohio State certified in:

- Basic Firefighting
- Emergency Medical Technician – Ambulance (EMT-A)
- Twenty-four (24) firefighters are Ohio State certified as paramedics.



The vehicle inventory of the Fire Department is:

- 3 – Cars
- 6 – Pumpers
- 4 – Medic Units
- 1 – 3,000 Gallon Water Tanker
- 1 – Heavy Rescue
- 1 – Grass Fire Truck
- 1 – 100' Aerial Truck (Quint) - Delivery in November 1982

Fire and medic runs for the last three (3) years are as follows:

1979 – Fire – 460	Medic – 1072 = Total – 1532
1980 – Fire – 426	Medic – 1126 = Total – 1552
1981 – Fire – 474	Medic – 1135 = Total – 1609

The Fire Department operating revenue is derived from a three (3)-mill tax levy, voted on by the City and Township alike.

One of the first pieces of fire equipment purchased by the Fire Department, a 1946 Chevrolet pumper, has been refurbished and is used as an antique showpiece at various civic functions.
