Residential Underground Storage Tank Guidelines

1. PRERARATORY STEPS:

- a. Contact a contractor and complete the *Residential Underground Storage Tank Permit* (NO PERMIT FEE).
- b. Schedule removal or abandonment date and time with the Fire Prevention Bureau (a Fire Inspector is required to be present at the time the tank is ready to be removed from the ground or abandoned).

2. DAY OF REMOVAL OR ABANDONMENT:

- a. Uncover tank.
- b. Open tank (opening large enough to examine the interior).
- c. Pump out contents (liquid, sludge, etc.).
- d. Clean out remaining product.
 - Note: Dispose of tank contents in an approved manner.
- e. Remove piping, vents and supply lines (if applicable).

REMOVAL:

1. Excavate and remove tank.
2. Label tank ends with "Combustible Vapor" (spray paint).
3. Dispose of tank in an approved manner.
 - The contractor shall confirm that the tank is a non-tank (properly destroyed) and confirm with owner by written documentation that this has been accomplished. A copy of this documentation shall also be furnished to the Beaver Creek Township Fire Department.
4. Provide the Fire Prevention Bureau with disposal paperwork from the approved location

ABANDONMENT:

1. Introduce an approved inert material.
2. Plug or cap all tank openings.

Note: Tanks may *not* be reused for storage of flammable/combustible liquids.

3. NO TANK LEAK — NO ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

4. IF TANK IS LEAKING OR HAS LEAKED:

- a. Excavate area until **NO** product is detected.
 - This will be determined by a visual and smell test of the surrounding soil. The inspector will determine the acceptable level.
- b. Dispose of contaminated soil and product in an approved manner in accordance with Ohio EPA rules.
- c. If product leakage (fuel oil) exceeds more than 25 gallons, the Ohio EPA will be notified.
- d. Contractor to send a copy of the soil samples to the Fire Prevention Bureau if applicable.
